2024 KENTUCKY HUNGER DIALOGUE UNITES CAMPUS PARTNERS TO FIGHT FOOD INSECURITY

The 2024 Kentucky Hunger Dialogue brought together nearly 70 passionate participants from eight partner campuses and multiple community partners to tackle food insecurity in innovative and sustainable ways. Held on November 8, 2024 at Eastern Kentucky University, the event served as a hub for collaboration among students, faculty, and community leaders dedicated to ending hunger on and off campuses.

Participants engaged in interactive workshops, presentations, and networking sessions focused on creating actionable solutions to food insecurity.

Key topics included using food as medicine, food access, and navigating advocacy in the state government. Success stories from past initiatives inspired new ideas, while breakout groups developed campus-specific action plans to drive meaningful change.
